Welcome to the second newsletter of the academic year. The new term has been so busy that the summer holidays seem like a distant memory!



# Parents' Evenings – Tuesday 17<sup>h</sup> October and Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October

We will be holding Parents' Evenings on the above dates. BOTH parents' evenings will be face to face, in school.

Invitations to book your appointment will be sent out by text to the first priority contact at 4pm on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October. You will have the choice to book for **either** date but please only select **ONE** appointment on **either** Tuesday **or** Wednesday.

Appointments will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Face to face meetings will be kept to 10 minutes per appointment and parents will have the opportunity to look at their child's books prior to the appointment.

These meetings are primarily an opportunity to meet your child's teacher and find out how they have settled into their new class.

#### **Internet Safety - Parental Controls**



Many children access the internet using tablets, mobile phones, games consoles etc. It is important to help them access the internet safely.

#### 'Make it Fun!'

Enjoy reading together with your child. Give characters funny voices and engage with the pictures in the book. Make a game out of finding words that rhyme or start with the same sound.

### Is my child too unwell for school?

As autumn and winter approach, it is likely that there will be increasing numbers of children and adults affected by winter illnesses, such as coughs, colds, influenza, respiratory infections and sickness and diarrhoea.

It can be tricky to know whether or not to keep your child off school or send them in.

There are government guidelines for schools about managing specific infectious diseases, which say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. This can be found here:

As a reminder, there is no need for children to be tested for Covid, unless specifically advised to do so by a health professional. If your child has a high temperature (over 38C), they should remain away from school until the temperature has dropped back down to normal (usually about 36.4C in children).
